

11 Now when Jesus had finished instructing his twelve disciples, he went on from there to teach and proclaim his message in their cities. 2 When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples 3 and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" 4 Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: 5 the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, those with a skin disease are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. 6 And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me." 7 As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? 

WHAT DO YOU FEAR? INSISTING ON HOPE THIS ADVENT

Luke's Gospel begins the story of Jesus with this opening line: "In the time of Herod..." This detail may seem minor to modern readers; however, it reveals layers of information about the fearful world Jesus entered, one filled with rampant oppression, economic disparity, uncertainty, and instability. A world not so unlike our own. And yet, throughout the stories of Christ's birth, we hear the whispers of angels delivering a surprising message: "Do not fear."

ADVENT WEEK TWO:



John the Baptist sends word to Jesus from his prison cell, asking, "Are you the one?" John has spent his entire life preparing the way for Jesus; but from his prison cell, now certainly facing death, the future looks grim. Like John, even the most confident of us wonders from time to time: Is all this work worth it? Does anything I do matter? Am I on the right track? We can't always see the fruits of our labor, yet God is at work anyway. How might we, like Jesus and Isaiah, point to the places where God is at work in our world? How might we keep hope alive?

The Pastoral Search Committee is recommending that our congregation call the Reverend Donald Erickson as our next settled pastor.

Candidating Weekend will take place on December 13 & 14. In the UCC, this is the culmination of a church's pastoral search process. This weekend's events will include the candidate meeting with the church staff and the Governing Board, a social event (meet & greet) for the congregation, and the candidate's participation in the Sunday worship service, which is followed by a congregational vote on the candidate.

You are invited to the following events:

- Saturday, December 13: 1:30-3:00 p.m. Informal social gathering in Fellowship Hall with light refreshments, giving our entire church family the opportunity to meet and get to know Rev. Erickson and his family.
- **Sunday**, **December 14: 10:15 a.m.** Worship Service in the Sanctuary. Rev. Erickson will lead worship and preach the sermon.
- Immediately Follow Sunday Worship: A congregational meeting will be held in the Sanctuary. All church members in attendance will have the opportunity to ask questions of the Pastoral Search Committee and then vote on the call for Rev. Don to become our next pastor.
- A Potluck Lunch in Fellowship Hall will follow the congregational meeting.
