Call to Healing and Opening Prayer

In our Hebrew scripture lesson the young man David, already secretly anointed by Samuel as king over Israel, arrives in Saul's encampment. Here the Israelites have engaged the Philistines. Goliath, a large and impressively arrayed Philistine warrior, has challenged the Israelites to produce duce anyone equal to him in battle, and David, hearing the challenge, volunteers. He goes to battle without the customary armor and fells Goliath with a single stone from his slingshot.

Years later, David wrote this Psalm as he reflected on his battle with Goliath. O Lord, you are known by your acts of justice; the wicked are trapped in the works of their own hands. The wicked shall be given over to the grave, and also all the peoples that forget you. For the needy shall not always be forgotten, and the hope of the poor shall not perish for ever. Rise up, O Lord, let not the ungodly have the upper hand; let them be judged before you.

When in this past week have we forgotten the needs of the poor? When have we resorted to judgement instead of leaving it to God?

Let us pray.

God our protector, you stood by David in the time of trial. Stand with us through all life's storms, giving us courage to risk danger to protect those who are oppressed and poor, that they may know you as their stronghold and hope. Amen.



Gospel

Mark 4:35-41

On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

About This Morning's Music. William Whiting wrote *Eternal Father Strong to Save* in 1860 in England. It has become a favorite of seafaring people in English-speaking countries. In America, its affiliation as the "Navy Hymn" is prompted in part by the practice dating from 1879 of concluding the Sunday services at the Naval Academy at Annapolis with the first stanza of this hymn. The first three stanzas of this hymn appeal to the Trinity

with Scripture passages where each Person controlled the sea, while the final stanza summarizes the hymn and promises continued praise "from land and sea."

Every Time I Feel the Spirit is an African-American, or Negro, spiritual, a genre of traditional song that was the product of enslaved Africans living in the southern United States in the pre-Civil War era. Like most spirituals, *Every Time I Feel the Spirit* was inspired by a Biblical verse (Galatians 4:6) or story that resonated with the enslaved's experiences of oppression and of their hope for freedom. Also like so many, its words signified more to those enslaved than they would convey to their enslavers.

WAIM Back to School Program provides vouchers from WAIM to eligible school families for school clothing and uniforms. Last year we assisted 401 students returning to classes with a brand new uniform or outfit for the first day of school. The BTS program assists Windham/Willimantic area families who are struggling financially and need to purchase uniforms or school clothes. Families and receive vouchers later so that each child will have a uniform,/new outfit for the first day of school. Vouchers are for \$25 per child. The **No Freeze Shelter** is in need of sunscreen, insect repellent and camping supplies in these warm months when many without homes are camping.
